Hospice Fredericton Services

Hospice House

Hospice House is a 10 bed residential facility providing 24 hour care to palliative patients and their families. Care is offered by a specialized team of nurses, support staff and physicians in a caring, home-like, environment. Through physician referral, patients can be admitted to the facility from their homes or hospital. All admissions are on a volunteer basis. Hospice House also provides rentable rooms for families who find travel difficult during this time.

Patients must be registered in the palliative program to be eligible for inpatient care within Hospice House. A palliative physician determines if a patient is eligible for admission.

Following receipt of a referral, our admissions team will work closely with the patient, family and medical partners (such as Extra Mural) to ensure a smooth transition to the facility at the appropriate time.

J.T. Clark Family Centre— Adult Day Program

The J.T. Clark Family Centre offers a safe, caring, nurturing environment with programming for individuals with mild to moderate cognitive and/or physical impairments. Clients are provided with structured day programming, lunch, snacks and many varied activities. From July, 2019 to March, 2020 the Adult Day Centre was open 141 days serving 26 clients for a total of 1044 visits. Unfortunately, due to COVID restrictions, the program was suspended in March 2020.

Community Services

Hospice staff and volunteers work with our medical partners to help support those being cared for at home during end-of-life. Community programs include:

- **In-home support**—a home visitation program delivered by trained volunteers who provide emotional support to both patient and family.
- **Care for the Caregiver** volunteers are available to provide relief care allowing families to take a break.
- **Narrative Care** this program helps focus on the patient's lives helping identify their joyful experiences. Narrative volunteers help patients re-tell the story of their lives and share their memories with loved ones.
- Grief Support Hospice offers a 6 week grief support group. This group is facilitated by two experienced social workers and is both supportive and educational.



HOSPICE BOUTIQUE



Since 2015, Hospice Boutique has provided a sustainable source of revenue to support the operational costs of Hospice Fredericton. Hospice Boutique offers a unique shopping experience with 6500 square feet of "new-to-you" treasures.



The new location at 984 Prospect Street is managed

and run by a team of dedicated staff and volunteers. All inventory is provided through generous donations from the community and eligible for tax receipts. Every time you shop at Hospice Boutique, you are not just enjoying a unique shopping experience with tax-free pricing, you are supporting your community Hospice.

68 volunteers gave nearly 4600 volunteer hours at the Hospice Boutique. That's an average of 590 hours per month! In addition, the Boutique received 4574 donations, averaging 415 per month.
